Subject:- Grant of Extended Permission to Sushrutha Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Prashanti Kuteera, Jodi Bingipur, Jigani Hobli, Anekal Taluk, Bangalore, 560106, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0091) with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 08 Seats in 02 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Dravyaguna Vigyan-03 seats, ii) Kyachikitsa-05 seats, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Sushrutha Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Prashanti Kuteera, Jodi Bingipur, Jigani Hobli, Anekal Taluk, Bangalore, 560106, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0091)**, inspection was conducted on **03.04.2025 & 04.04.2025** in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to process the **Extended Permission for 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 08 Seats in 02 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Dravyaguna Vigyana-03 seats, ii) Kyachikitsa-05 seats, for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024 and Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, due to the following shortcoming:**

i. **Teaching staff for UG: -**

Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course as per part-1 submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{41}{45} \times 100\% = 91.11\% \text{ (Excluding Excess)}$

3. Further, assessment report was duly placed in the **136th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)** convened on 24.07.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Further, the Board also observed that the college is meeting the notified & requisite criteria for the issuance of the Extended Permission for 100 seats in UG as per regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and for 08 Seats in 02 PG courses as per Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024 as the college has been permitted for last three consecutive years with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 08 Seats in 02 PG courses. Accordingly, the Board decided as follows:

- To issue Extended Permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.
- To issue Extended Permission in PG with intake capacity of 08 Seats in 02 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Dravyaguna Vigyana-03 seats, ii) Kyachikitsa-05 seats, in accordance with Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

4. Therefore, **Sushrutha Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Prashanti Kuteera, Jodi Bingipur, Jigani Hobli, Anekal Taluk, Bangalore, 560106, Karnataka**(Inst. ID AYU0091) is hereby granted with:-

- a) Extended permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and;
- b) Extended permission in 02 PG courses with intake capacity of 08 seats in subjects namely i) Dravyaguna Vigyana-03 seats, ii) Kyachikitsa-05 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024;

5. The aforementioned decision is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-

- i) It is informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats in UG Course and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 08 seats in 02 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- ii) It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

7. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**

8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

9. **You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**

10. **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
- ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
- iv) All the requirement of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standard of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022
- v) The compliance of shortcoming mentioned in para- 02.

11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical

Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
